Opening Prayer led by April Eilers

1. Business arising from minutes:

- a. Faye Murray Wed. Oct. 2 from 6:30-8 PM Faye is a mental health and physical wellness coach who shared about the positive benefits of mindfulness, physical strategies to calm/de-stress such as tapping and regulation strategies while making resource suggestions available to parents minimal attendance of parents/a few staff need to advertise more/ explanation of what is along with it so parents know that it applies to them, and they should make time to come
 - i. Offer more hospitality coffee, babysitting, pizza to host repetitive communication
 - ii. Discussion if communication (flyers) be sent home in backpacks would be more beneficial?
 - iii. Repetitive communication: Sent in weekly memo, school messenger, Facebook page
- b. Graduation next year Gr. 7 parents to decorate for the Gr. 8's each year communicate in the fall Mr. Fisher is communicating about Grad/Gr. ½ trip expectations In Grant's email to the Gr. 7 & 8 parents he mentioned that in the past years parents haven't shown interest in volunteering to organize fundraising to offset costs of the trip, but it should be noted that parents are not allowed to fundraise.

- i. Mr. Fisher discussed with students about ways for them to make their own trip funds (eg. rake leaves, etc)
- ii. Conclusion: parents are not to fundraise students will raise their own funds
- c. **Ball diamond update**? Community support? No update yet as we don't have any funds to spend on gravel (\$500) in the meantime we can start thinking of talking to people to find volunteers with the right equipment to do the work. If we raise \$, we can purchase new gravel for ball diamond.
 - i. Money fundraised can go towards gravel (like the gravel already out there)
 - ii. Once money is raised we will start communicating about parent volunteers
 - iii. Did not follow through with the Community Grant need 10% of the total cost (show receipts). Were advised to "hold back until we have the funds"
- d. Bibles- what would the school like? which one was bought in past that was mentioned last meeting that they do like? (few samples here) Adventure Bible need a primary Bible Jen or Monique to find out need/good one
 - i. Looking for/in need of primary Bibles (with graphics, etc)
 - ii. April to look into the Adventure Bible. Catholic Bible only available online in a digital version - waiting to hear back from Publisher if there is a printed version
 - 1. Adventure Bible geared to Grade 2 to 5, includes all Books, questions, etc
 - iii. Jen will discuss with Monique about finding the "correct" one from year's past
- e. Stem? April has info on some sources- kits for classes? or individual one time kits, or general stem supplies that single use, or other? Syringes and hoses for hydraulics, gears, electronic components, or other- what would the teachers like to see? (some samples here)
 - i. April connected with Jenna Meyers Makers Space what do we need?
 - ii. Suggestions from teaching staff reps: magnifying glasses, hammers, nails, screws, building stuff like Lego
 - iii. Discussion about how the School would benefit from a Lego Wall
 - 1. Lego Drive announcement to be sent in the weekly memo from Mary
- 2. **Financial report** Current CSAC funds = **\$0** (all funds were spent on trees/Grad) remaining \$2049.25 HST rebate is from school portion of HST
 - i. Stacie stated the current CSAC bank account is still at \$0
 - ii. Dieleman's: only a few orders so far (about \$95.00).
 - 1. School receives 30% on snacks, foods and gifts. 40% on gift wrap
 - iii. Lily's Love: About 5 orders so far (about \$125.00)
 - 1. School receives 25%
